



City Leadership

The City of Auburn operates under a Council-Manager form of government, in fact Auburn was the first city in Maine to adopt this form of government in 1917. The city council is comprised of the mayor and seven councilors. The mayor is elected by a majority of voters and serves a two-year term. The city's five voting wards each elect one councilor to represent their ward, and two at-large members are elected citywide. All serve two-year terms.

The city manager is the chief executive officer of the city, executing policy set by the mayor and council. The manager prepares/administers the annual budget, directs day-to-day operations, develops/administers policies and procedures, recommends policies and programs to the council, represents the city on boards, committees, organizations, and commissions, and much more.

Trash & recycling.

The City of Auburn provides curbside trash and recycling collection Monday through Friday, with occasional exceptions for holidays. Trash is collected weekly; recycling is collected every 2 weeks, depending on the street you live on.

Be sure to have all trash & recycling curbside no earlier than 6:00pm the night before and no later than 7:00am on your collection day. To find your collection day, scan the code below, or visit **auburnmaine.gov.** Any containers **with lids** are fine - they must be clearly marked.

Residents can also use the recycling bins located at 296 Gracelawn Road, which is open 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. Auburn residents can also drop household trash off at Maine Waste to Energy (110 Goldthwaite Road) at no charge. Simply drive through & drop off. Proof of residency may be required.

Bulky Waste

Auburn residents can dispose of household bulky waste YEAR-ROUND at Maine Waste to Energy (110 Goldthwaite Road) at no cost! MWE is open Monday-Friday, 7AM to 4PM and Saturday 7AM-noon. Proof of residency required (driver's license, utility bill, etc.).

Materials MWE will accept free of charge: Furniture, mattresses & box springs, air conditioners, tires, rugs, metals (no large auto parts and metals containing hazardous materials), propane tanks, and white goods (washers, dryers, refrigerators, small appliances, etc.).

For a fee, MWE will accept the following materials: Wood waste which includes construction and demolition debris, sheetrock, and shingles.

Composting

Auburn's Food Waste Composting Program is FREE. Bring your food/organic waste to the receptacles located on Gracelawn Road (near the recycling bins) or to the New Auburn Fire Station, 181 S Main Street.

Electronic Waste

Electronic waste such as TVs, computer monitors, and fluorescent bulbs can be brought to the Public Works Garage at 296 Gracelawn Road (free of charge).

Household Hazardous Waste

HHW can be dropped (up to 10 units for free) at the AVCOG Environmental Depot, 424 River Road in Lewiston. The depot is open on the third Saturday of each month from May to October, 8:00 - 11:45am.

Latex/acrylic paint can be put curbside with your regular household trash as long as it has been completely dried out with cat litter.

Brush, leaves, logs and other real wood products (no stumps or processed wood) can go to Oldcastle (481 Springwater Road, Poland) AT NO CHARGE. Oldcastle is open 6AM to 6PM, Monday through Saturday.



RECYCLE YOUR TEXTILES! Drop unwanted clothing, footwear, linens & accessories in the white "Apparel Impact" bin on Gracelawn Road (near the recycling bins). Textile recovery helps reduce landfill waste and many items recovered are given to those in need.

"Need to know" info.

Taxes

Real estate and personal property tax bills can be found on our website, auburnmaine.gov. Payments can be made in person at Auburn City Hall (60 Court Street) or online. Please note: processing fees may apply when using certain payment methods.

Licensing your dog

All dogs need to be licensed upon reaching the age of 6 months, or after the dog has been with the family for 10 days, if adopted. For an "altered" dog, the cost is \$7.00 for a new license or renewal. The cost for an "unaltered" dog is \$12 for a new license or renewal. You can license your dog at Auburn City Hall in the City Clerk's Office, or online at maine.gov. Annual licensing is required, and dog license renewals must be completed by January 31 or late fees will apply.

Motor Vehicle Registration

If you are a new Auburn resident, you do need to come to City Hall to register your vehicle. Once you have registered at least once with us, Rapid Renewal will be available in subsequent years. If you change your address within Auburn, come see us to update! Note: you must register your vehicle within 30-days of becoming a Maine resident.

Driver's License/State ID

To obtain, renew, or replace your Maine driver's license or state ID, you must visit the Bureau of Motor Vehicles (36 Mollison Way in Lewiston). Visit maine.gov for details. Note: you must apply for a Maine driver's license within 30-days of becoming a resident.

Vital records

Marriage licenses* are available from the City Clerk's Office on a walk-in basis, Monday through Friday 8:30AM-4:00PM

Vital records are available by submitting a request form to the City Clerk's Office along with the proper fee, photo ID, and proof of lineage or direct and legitimate interest.

Elections & Voting.

To register to vote, you must be a United States citizen, at least 16 years of age to pre-register to vote and have established a fixed principal home in Maine. To vote in a Referendum or General Election, you must be registered in the community where you live, and be at least 18 years of age.

To register to vote, or to make changes, you must fill out a voter registration application and submit it to the City Clerk's Office. You may also register to vote at your polling place on election day. Proof of Auburn residency and identification is required.

Maine now offers online voter registration. You can register to vote or make changes at maine.gov.

Where do I vote?

Wards 1 & 2: Auburn Senior Community Center, 48 Pettengill Park Road. Wards 3 & 4 vote at Auburn Hall, 60 Court Street. Ward 5 votes at the Boy's and Girl's Club, 43 Second Street.

Public Safety.



The Auburn Fire Department issues burn permits and firework permits. Visit wardensreport.com for burn permits. For fireworks permits, call 207.333.6633 X4.

Consumer fireworks in the City of Auburn are a violation of city ordinance and carry a fine of \$200 to \$1,000 for each violation. This includes firecrackers, bottle rockets, and missiles. Similarly, the use of sky lanterns is illegal in Maine.

Incident, fire, and EMS report copies can be obtained at Central Station for a small fee. Call ahead 207.333.6633 X3 to request the report.

Event requsts: The Auburn Fire Department welcomes requests for our firefighters to participate in events in the City of Auburn. Visit auburnmaine.gov to request our attendance at your event. The AFD will prioritize requests that offer the best opportunity for us to directly educate residents about fire safety.

Our dedicated Planning, Permitting & Code Department administers land use, building, housing, plumbing and electrical codes and oversees the development and implementation of improvement plans for various areas of the city, including Auburn's Comprehensive Plan. On the permitting and compliance front, we aim to help homeowners and developers complete their projects on time and in compliance with state codes and local ordinances. Tax relief.

*Adjusted by the city's certified ratio.

Rising property values can be challenging for property owners. However, not all residents take full advantage of existing property tax relief programs. There are several programs available - apply for these programs with the Assessor's office.

Homestead Exemption (\$25,000*) - Tax relief for eligible Mainers for their primary residence. Must own and occupy the property for at least 12 months as of April 1.

Veteran Exemption (\$6,000*) – Available to veterans who served during a recognized war period and who are 62 or older. Veterans receiving 100% disability may also qualify.

Paraplegic Veteran (\$50,000*) – Available to any eligible veteran who received a federal grant for a specially adapted housing unit.

Blind Exemption (\$4,000*) - Available to individuals determined to be legally blind by an ophthalmologist or optometrist...


The application deadline is April 1 each year for each exemption. Applications are available at Auburn Hall and at auburnmaine.gov. To check your exemptions, contact the Assessor at KScammon@auburnmaine.gov or 207-333-6601 X1118.

The State of Maine also offers the Property Tax Fairness Credit and State Property Tax Deferral. Contact Maine Revenue Services at (207) 624-5600 to learn more.

Auburn-Lewiston Municipal Airport

Nestled on 627 acres, Auburn is home to the **Auburn-Lewiston Municipal Airport**

(airport code "LEW"). LEW serves as one of the **business aviation facilities** in Maine for runway operations. It is a public use airport as well as a General Aviation Reliever Airport, which means it helps to relieve the smaller aircraft from the larger airports where commercial activity is operating.

ALMA has more than 50,000 operations each year which are comprised of itinerant, local, and military operations. The airport hosts sightseeing tours, air charter operators, flight schools and other businesses which contribute to sustained aeronautical and non-aeronautical supporting commercial activity.
