- 2. **Minutes** for 10.10.2024 Approved, one abstention
- 3. Public Participation: None

4. New Member nominations:

- **a.** Conservation Working Group: New members Kim Rand, Lisa Ruccolo
- b. Natural Products & Ag: Chloe Myera & Grant ? have applied to be members

- 5. City of Auburn Sustainability Initiatives Report (Phil Crowell)
 - a. Projects:
 - i. Each project Phil detailed focuses on energy efficiency
 - ii. City hall and library were enhanced with new boilers

- iii. New facilities manager will come to next SNRB meeting
- iv. Derrick Bellanger (sp?) was liaison with mechanical services, maintenance of city facilities, purchasing etc. and when he left his responsibilities have been assigned to a new representative (John) and purchasing responsibilities have been moved to an administrative position
- v. Rink floor replacement has improved efficiency
- vi. Salt brine system for PW trucks saves considerable sums annually
- vii. Entire PW fleet and PD fleet is GPS equipped and digitally connected
- viii. Brian Cullen pointed out that measuring raw energy units may be more accurate than reporting cost savings
- ix. EV charging systems are being added (Library, NSBA & PAL)
 - 1. One vendor is doing all of these installs
 - 2. All chargers thus far are free to use
 - a. The return on the investment was too long to allow for pay to use.
 - b. The chargers are paid for by hydropower credits
- x. The city has been addressing the sewage outfalls
 - 1. City has been deciphering where storm flow is intermingling with sewage
 - 2. The city has built a stormwater retention tank shared with lewiston, costs are shared according to proportional usage
- xi. Composting with schools is proceeding via agri-cycle
- xii. Citywide grant concerning food waste recycling (details?)
- xiii. Solid waste contract potential bidders:
 - 1. Casella
 - 2. Waste management
 - 3. Aroostook
 - 4. Agri-cycle

- i. Auburn has identified our action areas to meet state goals
- ii. The city needs to provide this as a grant update
- iii. Jay Brenchick is working with manufacturers on obtaining energy efficiency credits

- j. SNRB was created to enhance communication between working groups and city staff
- k. Potential to meet as needed (more frequent meetings)
- I. Perhaps SNRB receives some city funds and allocates those to workgroups?
